Privacy Notice and Cookies

For the purposes of the General Data Protection Regulation (UK-GDPR) the controller is MCTC.

For any personal data you provide for the purposes of your membership, MCTC is the Data Controller and is responsible for storing and otherwise processing that data in a fair, lawful, secure, and transparent way.

What personal data might we hold about you?

You may give us information about you by filling in forms at an event or online, or by corresponding with us by phone, e-mail or otherwise. This includes information you provide when you register with MCTC. The information you give us may include your name, date of birth, address, email address, and phone number.

Why we need your personal data and how we use it

We need your data so we can administer your membership and provide the membership services you sign up to when registering with MCTC. Our lawful basis for processing your personal is that we have a contractual obligation to you as a member to provide the services you registered for.

Reasons we need to process your data include:

- administration of MCTC membership forms and payment of fees.
- sharing data with Committee members for membership renewal, social events and club tournaments and promotions.
- sharing information with MCTC Captains for arranging match fixtures and reporting league results; (see also: [Playwaze site privacy policy](#)).
- sharing data with MCTC coaches or officials to administer training and coaching sessions.
- administration of the Wimbledon ballot.
- analysing anonymised data to monitor club trends.

Who we share your personal data with

MCTC does not supply any personal data it holds for this purpose to any other third party and it does not store or transfer it outside of the UK.

How long we hold your personal data

We will hold your personal data on file for as long as you are a member with us. Data is updated every year on our annual membership forms. Any personal data we hold on you will be securely destroyed after two years of inactivity on that member's account. Your data is not processed for any further purposes other than those detailed in this policy.

Your rights regarding your personal data

As a data subject you may have the right at any time to request access to, rectification or erasure of your personal data; to restrict or object to certain kinds of processing of your personal data, including direct marketing and to the portability of your personal data.

You are not obliged to share your personal data with us. If you choose not to share your personal data with us, we may not be able to register or administer your membership.

Cookies and other tracking tools

Cookies are small pieces of data stored on a site visitor's browser, usually used to keep track of their movements and actions on a site. Our website is hosted on the Wix.com platform and there are two types of cookies used:

- **Session (Transient) cookies:** these cookies are erased when you close your browser, and do not collect information from your computer. They typically store information in the form of a session identification that does not personally identify the user.
- **Persistent (Permanent/Stored) cookies:** these cookies are stored on your hard drive until they expire (i.e. based on a set expiration date) or until you delete them. These cookies are used to collect identifying information about the user, such as Web surfing behaviour or user preferences for a specific site.
